Find Out How - 9/9/2024

The Community Preservation Committee (CPC) is inviting residents to its annual public hearing on September 9, 2024 at 7:00 PM to learn about the Community Preservation process and share with the committee their ideas for use of the Community Preservation Funds.

The funds can be used for public or non-profit projects in the following categories:

- → Open Space funds can be used for the acquisition, preservation and creation of open space, including aquifers and watershed lands, agricultural lands, grasslands, fields and forest land, river, stream, lake and pond frontage, or lands that protect scenic vistas, wildlife or nature.
- → Recreation funds can be used for the acquisition, preservation and creation of recreation lands, including community gardens, trails, non-commercial youth and adult sports, parks, playgrounds and athletic fields.
- → Historical Preservation funding can be used for the acquisition, preservation, rehabilitation or restoration of properties listed on the State Register of Historic Places, *or* determined by the town's Historical Commission to be significant in the archaeology, architecture, history or culture of the town.
- → Community Housing Funds can be used for the acquisition, creation, preservation and support of Community Housing in Phillipston.
