Dear Friends,

Every year in December, we decorate our homes with lights, and put up traditional decorations. I remember the Swedish small white candles that rotated and chimed when the candles were lit. My mother also had electric candles at every window which looked impressive when you came around the curve to the house. There were also the English traditions of plum pudding and fruitcake. Another tradition comes from Germany.

According to <u>The Legend of the Candy Cane</u>, by Lori Walburg: The traditional candy cane was born over 350 years ago when mothers used white sugar sticks as pacifiers for their babies. Around 1670, the Cologne Cathedral choirmaster in Germany bent the sticks to represent a shepherd's staff. (or upside down, looks like a J, which can represent Jesus) This choirmaster used the white candy canes to keep the attention of small children during the long Nativity service. The use of candy canes then spread throughout Europe.

In the mid 1800s, the candy cane arrived in the United Sates when a German-Swedish immigrant in Wooster, Ohio decorated his spruce tree with paper ornaments and white sugar canes. The red stripe was added to the candy cane at the turn of the century, when peppermint and wintergreen were added and became the traditional flavors for the candy cane. Some sources say that a candy maker in Indiana developed the candy cane as a witness to Christ's love. Your sister in Christ,



TRANSFER STATION HOLIDAY HOURS



CENSUS – From The Town Clerk's Office

It's almost that time of year again it's exciting the year 2020 Census.

The Town of Phillipston census will be mailed out for January 1, 2020. This year you will be doing 2-two census filings. One for the Town of Phillipston and one for the Federal Government.

The Town of Phillipston census is in January and February. The Presidential primary is March 3,2020 so make sure your voter registration information is up to date.

The Census 2020 for the Federal Government will start in March and April. This year the Federal Census will be on line and by phone call. You must respond and if you don't there will be a Census agent knocking on your door. All information given to the Census is confidential no information is shared with any other Federal, State or local agency or town. The Federal Census will **never** ask for your Social Security Number.

The Federal Census will **never** ask for money or payment of any kind.

The Federal Census will **never** ask for Credit Card Information.

The Federal Census will **never** as for checking or savings account numbers.

Census workers do not need access into your home under any circumstances.

Please be aware of scams that may happen at this time of year.

The data collected is very important for Federal and State funding to our area and town. Remember 2-two census mailing this year. No information is shared or released to any other agency Federal, State or local. Contact the Town Clerk's Office at 978-249-1733 if you have questions.


