In Al's obituary it said, "Al helped in his community always quietly and in the background. Al sincerely enjoyed the simple things in life."

Enjoying the simple things is the key to mental health during this pandemic. I continue to write in my blessing book every day. What are the simple things you enjoy? A sunset, a child's smile, seeing a fox run across the road? Or the wonderful scent of a well cooked meal, the touch of a loved one, or the beauty of a branch covered in snow? Perhaps you love the smell of vanilla, or apples cooking or the scent you smell when you peel an orange? Thank God for the sense of smell, and I feel sorry for anyone who has lost that sense.

There is so much that is not in our control, that if we focus on the simple things as Al Watts did than we can be filled with blessings even in the most difficult circumstances. 2022 Census

The Annual Town Census has been mailed out to each household at the first of the year. Please list everyone living at your address even if it is a temporary situation. It is very important to collect this information every year. The information is used for school registration, to plan on how many kindergarten students will be starting their education. Census figures help the town to apply for grants with accurate population figures and showing a breakdown of age groups. If you are new to town answering the census does not register you to vote, you can go to the Secretary of State's Website and register. Not responding to the census will place you on the inactive voters listing. So please send your completed Census form and mail it **back right away** and make compiling this info easier.

2nd notices for the census were mailed out in February.

During this time of emergency, it's important for our emergency responders to know where you and your household member are located.

If you don't have a census form you can use a piece of paper, write down the full name and date of birth of each person living at your address then sign and date the paper. **Drop it into**the Town Hall mail slot on the door or mail it to:

Cable TV Survey Results

Thanks to those who completed the survey. The results received to date are summarized below. There will also be a public hearing next year with Comcast. Town residents are also welcome to contact the Cable Advisory Committee. All feedback will be presented to Comcast at the public hearing and discussed with Comcast again during the license renewal negotiations.

There are about 885 residences in Phillipston. Thirty (30) survey responses (3.4%) have been received. Although a response rate of 2% is typical for mailed surveys, more feedback would help.

CABLE ACCESS – QUESTION #1

Ten (10) people responded that they do not subscribe to Comcast TV cable service. The reasons for not subscribing were: Cost – seven (7) responses, No cable Access – one (1) response, Other (reasons not specified) – two (2) responses

If you do not have access to cable service at the street, please contact the Cable Advisory Committee. Although it may take considerable time, the Town may be able to help with getting cable access at the street.

QUALITY & SERVICE – QUESTIONS #2, #3 & #4

There were 28 responses to these questions. Less than half the responses (13) rate Comcast service quality as average, while 23% (6) rated it above average and 30% (8) below average. Of the 28 responses, 22 indicated they needed a service technician. When people contacted Comcast, 58% (15 responses) approved and 12% (3 responses) strongly approved. In contrast, 19% (5 responses) disapproved and 12% (3 responses) strongly disapproved. Overall, the results indicate a service quality of slightly below average and a similar leaning toward disapproving the quality of the problem resolution. The large portion of respondents requiring a technician is disconcerting.

TOWN CABLE TV STATION (Channel 99) - #5, #6, & #7

Of the 29 responses, 14 people have watched Channel 99. Of those 12 people found the information being broadcast useful. When asked if people would be interested in having other programs broadcast, 25 of the 28 people who responded were interested.

Besides responding to the questions, some people included comments on their surveys. The comments include:

PRICING – (This is not covered by the license renewal contract; however, the feedback will be passed on)

They (Comcast) charge too much for service. Comcast's rates are too high and their customer service is terrible. The cost of Comcast is very expensive. There should be a senior discount.

TOWN TV STATION – Sound and picture quality need improvement. Events broadcast are not current enough. It would be helpful to know when events, meetings, etc. are to be televised ahead of time.
