A Reminder to Dog Owners

Dog Licenses Expire the last day of December. The new dog tags and licensees are available at this time in the Town Clerk's Office

All dogs must be licensed after 6 months of age Dogs must have an up to date rabies vaccination (New licenses are issued every year in January)

No owner or keeper of a dog shall permit such animal to run at large except on his own premises.

(Run at large – means free of restraint and permitted to wander on private or public ways and property)

All dogs shall be restrained <u>on a leash</u> or under immediate control of its owner or keeper.

(Dogs running at large maybe impounded and a citation will be issued and a fee of \$50.00 will be charged plus

\$15.00/day board – and if the dog is unlicensed another fee of \$50.00 will be charged)

This year the dog officer will be issuing citations to owners of unlicensed dogs. The citation will instruct the owner to appear before the Selectmen or to the Court House to pay their fine.

Also remember that your neighbors may not want your dog running through their yard. We have a small town here and it's very hard to take care of all the complaints so

try to be a good dog owner and obey the rules.
