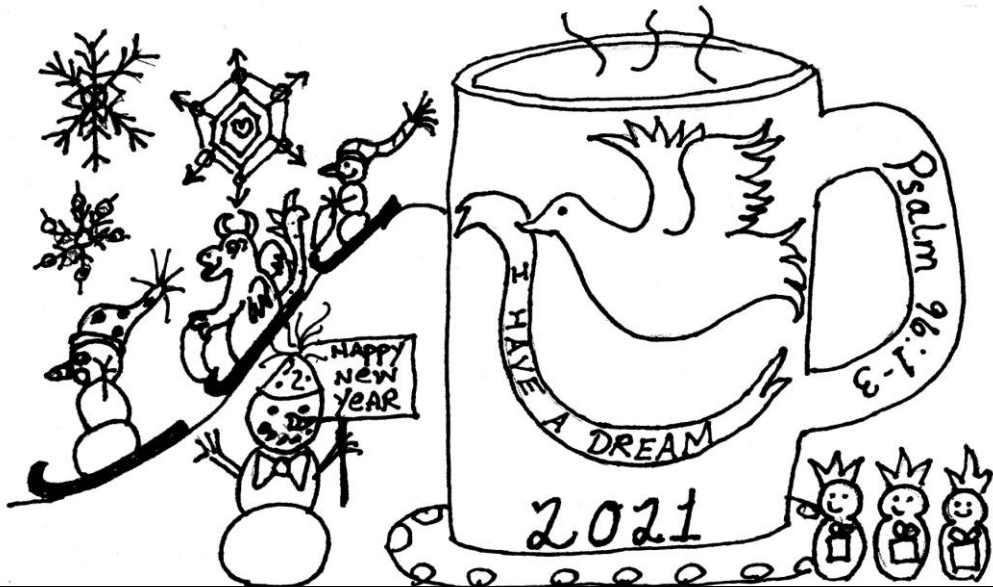

Dear Friends,

May God's light shine brightly in your lives in the coming year. We will be celebrating Epiphany on Sunday, January 3. In the darkness of midwinter, I remember the Epiphany, the light the Wisemen followed to find Jesus and I share the story of "We Three Kings" with you from Stories Behind the Best Loved Songs of Christmas.

Henry Hopkins, Jr. did not have any children of his own, but he loved his nephews and nieces. He was an ordained Episcopal priest, and graduated from law school in New York City, but decided to be a New York newspaper reporter. One year he wanted to write a tribute to the Wisemen, which would be part of his gift to his family. He combined the Biblical record of their trip with the legends passed down over almost two thousand years. The carol does have a mysterious element to capture the image of a trip across the desert on camels. He focused mostly on their gifts, "Gold I bring him to crown Him again, Frankincense to offer have I, Myrrh is mine, its bitter perfume." The Gospel according to Matthew does mention these three gifts, but we do not know for sure if there were three astrologers or more. We know there were three gifts.

Epiphany is one of my favorite liturgical seasons for its focus is on the light, and spreading the Word to all. In this time of darkness, we need Epiphany.

2020 TOWN EMPLOYEE OF THE YEAR NOMINATIONS

Do you know a Phillipston town employee whose dedication and efforts deserve special recognition for the past year? The ‘Commitment to Excellence’ Award provides the opportunity for residents, department heads and Town employees to recognize individuals for demonstrating excellent performance over the past year. Any full time or part time employee under the direct or indirect supervision of the Chief Administrative Officer is eligible for consideration. They do not need to be a Phillipston resident. The selected employee will receive a plaque, letter of recognition, and cash gift of \$250. Awards will also be given for “Unsung Hero” and “Role Model.”

Criteria. The Chief Administrative Officer will consider nominees who:

- Are full time or part time employee under the direct or indirect supervision of the CAO;
- Have increased productivity, performed appropriately beyond job responsibilities, provided cooperative and positive working relationships, demonstrated a pattern of high-quality work, has offered a creative or innovative idea to improve town operations, efficiency, or saved costs to the Town, and provided courteous service to the public and other departments.

Nomination forms are available in the lobby at Town Hall or on the town website, www.phillipston-ma.gov. Residents, department heads or other employees may nominate an employee by submitting the form below with a detailed explanation on how the nominee has met one or more of the above criteria. Limit your nomination statement to the space on the form. Self-nominations will also be allowed and are encouraged. Note: this is not a popularity contest, multiple nominations don’t increase anyone’s chances. Nominations must be received by the Chief Administrative Officer by Tuesday, January 19, 2021. Please return nomination forms to the Selectmen’s Office.

A LETTER FROM THE PLANNING BOARD

To Phillipston Residents:

December 21, 2020

The Planning Board is asking residents and voters of Phillipston for input on any potential changes in the Marijuana Establishment Zoning Bylaw. At the 2020 Annual Town Meeting a moratorium was voted on marijuana establishments. There were concerns at prior Town Meetings at which time the Planning Board indicated it would give voters the opportunity to speak on any potential amendments. That time is now, and we must prepare any amendments by process before any Town Meeting vote.

The Bylaw for Marijuana Establishments, Sec #21, is online and can be found on the home page www.phillipston-ma.gov. In the Town Links click on "Zoning Matters." It will take you to webpage with that section of the bylaw. If after reading the content you have any suggested changes, concerns, questions or comments, please send them in writing as instructed below. Once we know the public opinion then we will have better idea how to proceed.

On another matter the Planning Board received a copy of a citizens' petition to prohibit dirt bikes and motocross tracks in the Phillipston Zoning Bylaws in all zones. A copy of the proposed amendment also can be found under Zoning Matters. We are looking for comments on this proposed amendment also.

The Planning Board looks forward to working with our community to hear everyone's perspective and keep our community a safe and peaceful place to live.

Any registered voter may use this application to request an absentee ballot for a local election being held on or before March 31, 2021.

Completing the Application

1. Voter Information – Provide your name, legal voting address, and date of birth. Telephone number and e-mail address are optional fields.
2. Ballot Information – Provide the address where you want the ballot mailed.
3. Special Circumstances – If you are assisting a voter in completing this application, complete this section.
4. Sign your name. If you require assistance in signing the application, you may authorize someone to sign your name in your presence. That person must complete the assisting person's information in Section 3.

Submitting the Application

Send the completed application to the local election official at your city or town hall.

Applications can be mailed or hand-delivered. Applications may also be submitted electronically by fax or e-mail, as long as your signature is visible.

Please allow ample mailing time for this application and for the ballot. Ballots must be returned to your local election official by Election Day.

Town honors Dodge, Wilson as Citizens of the Year

Phillipston made a special award to Alphonse W. Chartier in 1986 when he retired after many years of service as Chief of Police to the town. They called the award “The Citizen of the Year.” Townspeople liked the idea of recognizing a person who served the town in ways that made it a better place and decided that what started as a one-time recognition should become an annual tradition.

On the cold blustery Dec. 6 afternoon, townspeople gathered outside in front of the Town Hall to honor the two people selected for this year’s award: Police Chief Kevin Dodge and Don Wilson, who recently passed on.

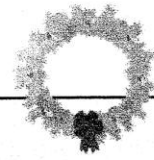
Police Chief Kevin Dodge was commended for his 20 years of service, 11 years as chief, the excellent camaraderie in the department under his leadership, the calm way he handles situations, the benefits of his training programs, and how he leads by example. He goes the extra mile to keep the town a pleasant and safe place to live. At a time when many communities are criticizing their police departments, Phillipston holds only praise for theirs.

Don Wilson was appreciated for his many contributions to the town. He served as president of the Queen Lake Association, initiated the writing of the history of the lake, and donated land for the building of the new dam. He was a generous contributor to the Congregational Church and an active member of the Historical Society; he arranged for the historic Goulding Mills property to be donated to the Society. He had a great love of nature and purchased open lands to donate to Harvard Forest and Fisheries and Wildlife so those parcels would be conserved for all time. His outreach made a difference.

Their names will be added to the plaque in the Town Hall that commemorates those honored in years past.

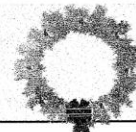
