I am particularly excited about the entertainment for the Bazaar on June 10, because it is a Bavarian Music Concert featuring brass, woodwinds, accordion and drums. As I read through the Cultural Council application from the Hofbrauhaus Bavarian band the applicant, Karl Rausch, explains that Bavarian music is part of the Germanic Culture stretching back to the first Oktoberfest in Munich 200 years ago. The German ethnic community is the largest migrant group to the United States. This particular band has existed for over 45 years and has toured Germany and continues to perform all over New England.

The Phillipston Cultural Council, which is a local agency and is supported by the Massachusetts Cultural Council, a state agency, is sponsoring Karl Rausch and his Hofbrauhaus Bavarian Band at the Bazaar on the Phillipston Common between 4 o'clock and 7 o'clock on Saturday, June 10. They are looking for a new home and will not go out of their way to bother you. Please let us know as quickly as possible, so we may be able to catch them and hive them safely on our farm. Also, some bees tend to find a home in a house, barn or other outbuildings, or sometimes in nearby trees. If you do notice you have become a host and do not want them, call us. First, we will determine if they are indeed honeybees. Secondly, we will determine if we can safely and efficiently trap them. Some types of removals require carpentry or masonry skills that are beyond our capabilities, and we will come to terms before doing or not doing anything. If you're interested in how they are doing, we would allow visitation rights at agreed times, and name the hive in your recognition.

Please understand that we both work at jobs outside the home, too, so at times we silence our phones. Please try both, and leave a message if no answer.

#### FOOD ALLERGY AWARENESS WEEK MAY 14-20

My name is Hannah Bennett, a sophomore at Narragansett. I chose Food Allergy Awareness and Bullying as my Girl Scout Gold Award Project because unfortunately I experience both. Some people don't understand or don't care how serious a food allergy can be (it's not just sneezing!), so I created a presentation at school, which is currently being shown on the Phillipston Cable Channel, Tues, Thurs, Sat and Sun at 4pm, and Sun at 8pm. Governor Baker agreed that this issue needs more attention and granted my request to issue a Proclamation of Food Allergy Awareness Week, and Susannah Whipps Lee who helped me along the way came to Phillipston last week to present it to me along with a citation from the House.

An informational poster is also on display in the town hall. Please check it out to see how you can help someone having an attack and, even better, prevent allergic reactions in others!

The most important thing you can do is <u>ASK</u> before bringing food to an event whether someone there may be allergic to one of your intended foods. The most common food allergies are: NUTS - PEANUTS - MILK - EGGS - SOY - WHEAT - FISH - SHELLFISH COCONUT AND SESAME

# Nuts and peanuts can cause deadly reactions just by being near an allergic person, whether they eat or touch it or not. Please reconsider using them at public events!

The second most important thing everyone should do is to <u>LABEL</u> your dish if it contains any of the above. LABELS SAVE LIVES!

And third, learn to recognize the signs of anyone having a reaction - swollen lips closing throat, wheezing, rash, hives, and <u>CALL 911</u>. Even if the person has their epi-pen, that only buys time to get to the hospital to treat the reaction itself.

Thank you for your kind attention to this issue - it truly is a matter of life and death!

How are the pumpkin growing contestants doing? By now, pumpkins could have been started indoors in containers and be ready for transplant when the ground warms a tad more. There is plenty of time for the smaller type pumpkins to be directly planted into a hill, or still planted indoors in a container and then transplanted for a quicker start. For Giant Pumpkin growers, the seeds should have been started by mid-May if you wanted a 1,000 pounder. You could still get a 600 pounder...!

My Big Max pumpkins were just planted in containers in late May, so some of you may have a commanding lead if yours have already sprouted, or you have more time to give yours. I'm hoping for at least 1 Pumpkin around 100 lbs for the homeowners group of Big Max or similar pumpkins. The Giant Pumpkin class will be against their same type, not the homeowners group.
