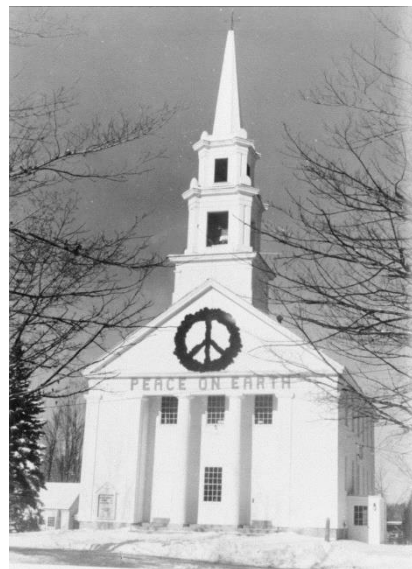
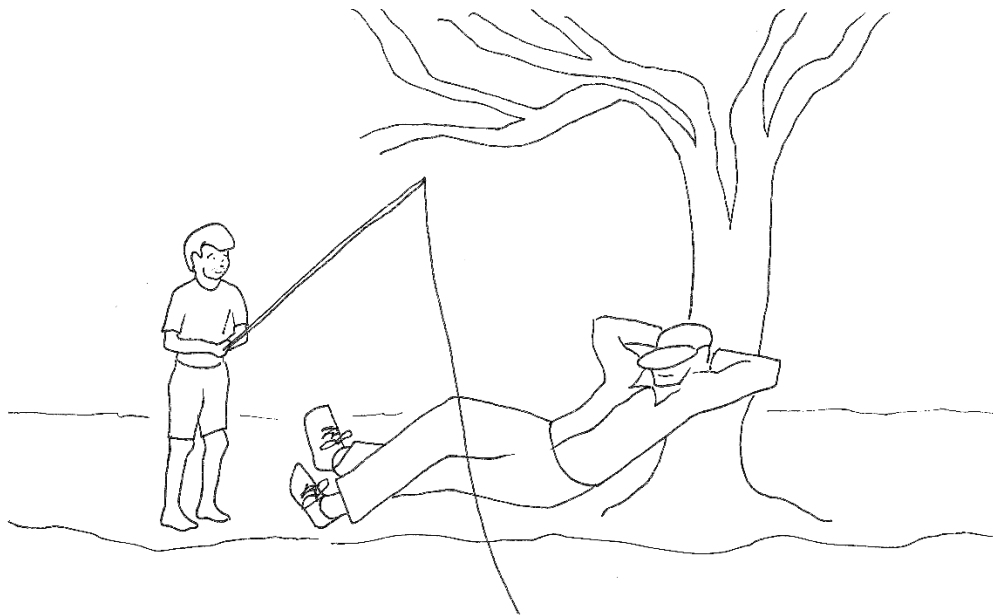

## Save the bees.

HoneyMoon Hill Bees and Farm at 770 Royalston Road provides free Honeybee mitigation services. If a swarm has taken up residence in your home, an outbuilding, vehicle, a cavity in a tree or if they have found a new and exciting place but you don't want them there please contact us. We have successfully removed colonies of honeybees from residential, commercial and industrial buildings.

If you aren't sure what type of insect it is please contact us. We will check them out for you for free! We are only interested in saving honeybees. If you have another type of stinging insect we can give you ideas how to get rid of them. We aren't nor want to be exterminators if they turn out to be wasps, hornets or yellowjackets. Our bee safety clothing is what we wear when tending our hives. We can't be getting toxins into our gear.

If you have honeybees in a building that require carpentry skills or restorative skills to put it back in order that are beyond our skills, we will discuss it with you. We are capable of some repairs. I certainly would not make a mess of your home and leave it. We could put you in touch with a beekeeping group who may have better resources.

We don't charge a fee for our services but we also don't pay for feral bee swarms or bee colonies. Feral swarms or colonies are bees not kept in a regulated hive structure or under the care of a beekeeper.

Historically beekeepers bear the costs of removal, taking the bees for free.
