

Dear Friends,

"I was a stranger and you welcomed Me...Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family you did it to Me." Matthew 25: 35

At a recent clergy meeting I attended one colleague was wearing a button that said, "I am an immigrant." Another colleague then claimed that she had an ancestor on the Mayflower. I turned to both of them and said, "I'm not going to treat either of you differently." They just laughed. And then I said, "I am an immigrant too." Alright - to be technical I should have said, "I am a child of immigrants, or more correctly a great granddaughter of an immigrant from Sweden, and a great granddaughter of an immigrant from Scotland. Both great grandmothers came through Ellis Island. But I am a child of immigrants, because none of my ancestors, the Pennsylvania Dutch on my mother's side, Glessners and Korns, the English Clarks, the Scottish Camerons, the English Stannards or the Swedish Bemers are Native American.

This past August Kevin, Andrew and I had the privilege of attending a Naturalization ceremony at Seneca Falls, the birth place of Rights for Women, near the home of Elizabeth Cady Stanton. We sat next to a man from Rochester, New York. I asked him where he was from and he replied, "Ethiopia." I asked him if he had any family at the ceremony. He replied, "No." I said, "we will be your family." So, I got him a cup of water, when he could not leave the room. And we cheered when they called his name. Open Burning Season will run from January 15-May 1, 2017.

Burn permits may be purchased at the *Fire Department*, 90 State Road, or at the *Town Hall*, 50 The Common. Permits are \$10 and are payable with cash or check made payable to the <u>Town of Phillipston</u>.

Residents may also download and complete the <u>Burn Permit Form</u> and mail the \$10 fee to the Phillipston Fire Department, 90 State Road, Phillipston, MA 01331. The form is available at http://www.phillipston-ma.gov/fire-department/pages/open-burning-information or can be detached below. Please complete and mail this application, with \$10 fee, to the Phillipston Fire Department, 90 State Road, Phillipston, MA 01331. Your permit will then be mailed to your residence.

Open Burning Season runs from January 15th through May 1st. All open burning shall be done only at the address that was provided to the Department on the permit application. Residents must call Dispatch at (978) 939-8875 each day that they wish to burn to obtain permission.

Only brush, cane, driftwood, and forestry debris that did not come from a commercial operation, may be burned. No lumber or building materials shall be burned at any time. No grass, hay, leaves, stumps, or tires may be burned.

Gasoline, kerosene, or other flammable liquids shall not be used to start or fuel the fire.

All open burning fires shall be attended at all times with an adult until such time as the fire is extinguished.

A fire extinguisher and working pressurized water supply (hose) and shovel/rake must be on site.

All open burning must be a minimum of 75 feet from all buildings (structures) and must be conducted between the hours of 10am and 4pm in accordance with D.E.P. C.M.R. 7.07.

Open burning permits can be rescinded if the winds accelerate or the atmosphere conditions change suddenly, making it unsafe to burn.

Mike Flye Presents <u>Confederate Reenactment Experiences</u> on March 15, 2017 at 7 P.M.

The "Historical Society of Phillipston" will have a program that will help us better understand a soldier's Civil War experiences. The Civil War was the most devastating war our country has endured, both emotionally and the number of war casualties. Everyone who died was an American.

Phillipston's Mike Flye has been participating in reenactments for **15 years** and has become an expert in its history. He belongs to a Confederate Company that has members from several New England states, and they do reenactments throughout eastern U.S. Mike rose from a private to a lieutenant, the rank he holds as an ordinance officer, the officer responsible for guns and ammunition.

As he tells us about the Civil War story and how reenactments bring it to life, *he will show Civil War artifacts that he has collected* -- a gun made by the Springfield Armory, uniforms, swords, supplies, and even a pin worn by his ancestor who met **President Lincoln** when he was stationed on the ironclad ship, the Monitor. Mike's ancestral stories will be woven together with the war's history, and the role he plays today in the reenactments.

The program will start at **7 P.M.** in the vestry of the Congregational Church. Refreshments will be served following the program. All are welcome!

At the Millers River Environmental Center, Dan, an employee of Hadley Garden Center, who attended Suny Cobleskill and UMASS, will discuss the proper tools to purchase and the best ways to use them. He will also discuss some of the pruning problems people run into. He will entertain questions on any pruning issues we may have.

An affiliate of the Millers River Environmental Center in Athol, the North Quabbin Garden Club formed in 2006 to encourage interest in all phases of home gardening. With efforts to promote better horticultural practices and foster civic beauty, emphasis is placed on use of native plants, organic gardening and the conservation of natural resources. Monthly meetings are usually held on the third Thursday evening of each month featuring informative speakers or workshop sessions. Members are currently working on a wildlife habitat garden at the Millers River Environmental Center. Guests and new members are always welcome, so join us this month and learn something new about gardening. Meetings are free to members and guests are asked for a donation. I grew up in Phillipston and after school and working in technology for a few years I have returned to the area. I am writing in to tell you about my company, City Compost. After learning of the issues that face our food system, I spent the past three years creating a service that makes the best quality compost possible in order to increase access to clean healthy food for everyone. You see all the nutrients in bits of food and the parts we do not eat can be saved and used to grow more food in the future, and this service makes it easy.

You may be familiar with compost or even composting at home. I knew of compost as a kid but have since learned how complex it really is. A big thing is you *can* include meat and dairy, it is just that these have special requirements because of wild animals. The service accepts all food types and provides many benefits to you as well. You will save time and fuel from trips to the transfer station and use less pay as you throw bags or cut waste collection to every other week. Even better is the ease of growing produce at home that comes with using compost. This will save you even more on groceries.

For you, it requires no long term commitment and is as easy as putting scraps into a different pail that will be gathered weekly. You will be set up with a kitchen pail, a container for collection, and of course a great service. Plus, if you want you can get all the compost back that made from your material. If not, it goes off to grow more food elsewhere. All this for only \$5 a week. You can call me directly at 978-378-3048 to learn more or sign up!!
