


Dear Friends,

Lent is always in March, and this year Ash Wednesday is February 26 and Easter is Sunday, April 12. We hope to have a great breakfast on Saturday, April 11 at Red Apple Farm for Easter's Great Gathering with good weather.

Lent is the time we remember that the night before his death, Jesus, gathered his disciples around him for one last supper. Death is imminent but Jesus does not isolate himself but rather he chooses to spend his last hours washing the disciples' feet. Their reactions were mixed and yet Peter, at first responds, "You shall never wash my feet," and later he goes to the other extreme and suggests that Jesus was his hands and his head also. Jesus insists, that Peter allow him to wash his feet. Perhaps what is important to remember that night is that Jesus wanted to still eat with the disciples, still serve them by washing their feet, and still be present to them. We cannot do faith alone, we don't have everything together, and we need each other. So, we turn to our family of faith, to help us, encourage us, and motivate us. Only clear or colored glass beverage and food containers are acceptable for recycling. Remove caps and covers. Anything else is not acceptable.

The Town will be charged an extra \$150.00 per ton for contaminated loads. *We have just been charged an additional \$810.00 for a load that had a 1 pound propane cylinder in the load*. Don't know how it got there, but please let the attendants put the glass in the roll off container. Put yours in the receptacles they have there for you to fill. Thank you for your cooperation.

Closing Phillipston Memorial School - This is not a drill :(

After a long, frustrating and ultimately unsuccessful budget battle last year, the school administration has put forth its proposed budget for next year closing Phillipston Memorial. This will allow them to hire a few more needed social/emotional counseling staff with a minimal increase to the bottom line, but would have a huge and irreversible impact to our town. Also, projected class sizes at Templeton Elementary School are still almost 30 kids per class because actual classroom teachers will be let go. Please review the budget presentation on the NRSD.ORG website main page (FY21 Budget Info, on the left side) to see their projections. Our students will lose their small setting, and all we have been able to provide them, on top of having a much longer bus ride to Templeton. Some Phillipston parents have been working for over a year to try to save our school and many ideas were thrown around, such as removing the school from the district and running it ourselves. That would be the most expensive option by many estimates. It seems the best option is to get the towns and the district to agree to alter the funding formula where each town pays for its own elementary school and then pay jointly for the middle and high school per student, as we have been doing, and still share administration and curriculum planning, again as we have always done.

<u>* We need action now to get this done asap and update the regional agreement accordingly.</u>

BOSTON POST CANE

Awarded to Robert Stevens

Phillipston's Boston Post Cane Honoree - On January 29, 2020 Robert Stevens of Williamsville Road, Phillipston received the honorary Boston Post Cane at the Select Board meeting. The 92 year old Stevens has lived in Phillipston for the past nine years. Pictured above are Robert Stevens (front

The Boston Post cane tradition was started by the former newspaper The Boston Post in 1909 where 700 Massachusetts towns (no cities included) were given a gold headed ebony cane with the request that it be presented to the oldest male citizen of the town and then be subsequently transmitted to the next oldest citizen upon his passing. Not until 1930 did the tradition include women when determining the oldest resident in each town. Today, Phillipston's Boston Post Cane is a replica which was created after the original cane was lost in a fire in 1947. The cane tradition in Phillipston was then interrupted for about 65 years until Emelda Haughton in 2012 felt it should be re-established. With the help of Phillipston's Historical Society, a replica of the cane was commissioned and purchased by the Society. This replicated cane is now on display in Phillipston's Museum of History on 80 State Road. Mr. Stevens received a formal certificate of recognition as well as a unique lapel pin featuring the cane award. Many friends and members of Mr. Stevens' family were in attendance and congratulated the honoree with joy.

Recyclables

Recyclables need to be sorted. There are separate containers for each category. If it is not in one of these categories then throw it away.

- 1. Cardboard and mixed paper, includes magazines and books. No Gift wrap.
- 2. Clean plastic containers empty & rinsed. No Tupperware or rigid plastics.
- 3. Aluminum, steel, and tin cans empty, rinsed and flattened if possible
- 4. Bottles & jars empty, rinsed and lids removed. No household glass i.e. drinking glasses or dishes. No Pyrex, no ceramics, or porcelain, no candle jars.
- 5. Returnable 5 cent cans or bottles please donate to the Scouts at their trailer.

Glass needs to be put in the bins for the attendants to put into the container. They know what is and is not allowed. Contaminated loads will be refused from the recycling center and will cost the town extra to be disposed of. This has already happened once.
