


The Historical Society of Phillipston Presents

The Rabbit Railroad and the Towns It Served presented by Ken Levine

on Tuesday, November 15 at 7:00 P.M. in the Phillipston Congregational Church Vestry

What did you do during Covid? Ken Levine tackled a huge project. He built a model of the four towns that were lost when the Quabbin Reservoir was created. And, most interesting is the recreation of the train that serviced those towns. Ken said, "The train was the life blood of the towns." It's called the Rabbit Railroad and sometimes the Bunny Hop because of the frequent stops it made.

The results of Ken's amazing 24-foot-long model of the towns is on display in the Swift River Valley Historical Society and it has a small model locomotive running through it to show how the train went from town-to-town and business-to-business from 1871 till the 1930's.

A great deal of research went into this project. Come watch the power-point presentation and learn about the lost towns and the train that served them. Everyone is welcome.
