

Mike Flye and His Confederate Reenactment Experiences September 20 at 7 P.M. in the Church Vestry

This program will start with a loud bang!*

Mike will display the firing of his cannon out on the church lawn and then we will gather inside to hear his talk that will help us to better understand a Civil War soldier's life. The Civil War was the most devastating war our country has endured, both in the number of casualties and the emotional strain of killing fellow Americans. The effects of it are still strong in the minds and emotions of many.

Phillipston's Mike Flye has been participating in reenactments for 16 years and has become an expert in its history. He belongs to a Confederate Company that does reenactments throughout the eastern U.S. As he tells the war stories, he will show us his collection of Civil War artifacts to help bring the stories to life -- a gun, swords, supplies, uniforms, and even a pin worn by his ancestor who met President Lincoln when he was stationed on the ironclad ship, the Monitor.
