

Story Hour



Code Red is Coming to Phillipston!

The Town of Phillipston has partnered with CodeRED to create a town-wide Emergency Notification System. The CodeRED System provides Phillipston officials with the ability to quickly deliver personalized messages via voice, email, phone text and TDD/TTY capabilities to targeted areas or the entire Town of Phillipston in minutes.


Phone Numbers Necessary Code Red systems are only as good as the telephone number database supporting them. If your phone number is not in the database, you will not be called. all residents and businesses should log onto CodeRed and complete the registration form that can be filled out.

When you register you can choose whether you want to receive only emergency notifications or general announcements too, and you can add multiple phone numbers or email addresses for CodeRed to contact.


John Eklund's Man Cave
