I recently read this quote by John Ruskin, one of England's greatest thinkers of the 19th century. "There is no music in a rest, but there is the making of music in it." Ruskin was thinking about the importance of rests in a musical composition. He began to compare those rests put in by a composer to the "rests" that come to us in life, for example when we recuperate from surgery. There are times when our lives seem to be put on hold. We are compelled to sit and wait until we realize that God is now telling us to move on...out of the wilderness and into the Promised Land that God has prepared.

This reminds me of Beethoven's 5th Symphony. We think of the famous opening with repeated three notes and then a longer low note. These are followed by an eighth note rest. Without the rest, the music would be different. The anticipation would be much less intense and emotional.

As we anticipate Labor Day weekend we remember God's Ten commandments and the instruction to "remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord Your God. "

Have a blessed Labor Day weekend and come and visit the church sanctuary!

CPC Can Grant Funds

Find Out How – October 12th

The Community Preservation Committee (CPC) is inviting residents to its annual public hearing on October 12th at 7:00 PM in the Phillipston Town Hall, second floor, to learn about the Community Preservation process and share with the committee their ideas for use of the Community Preservation Funds.

The funds can be used for public or non-profit projects in the following categories:

- **Open Space** funds can be used for the acquisition, preservation and creation of open space, including aquifers and watershed lands, agricultural lands, grasslands, fields and forest land, river, stream, lake and pond frontage, or lands that protect scenic vistas, wildlife or nature.
- **Recreation** funds can be used for the acquisition, preservation and creation of recreation lands, including community gardens, trails, non-commercial youth and adult sports, parks, playgrounds and athletic fields.
- **Historical Preservation** funding can be used for the acquisition, preservation, rehabilitation or restoration of properties listed on the State Register of Historic Places, **or** determined by the town's Historical Commission to be significant in the archaeology, architecture, history or culture of the town.
- **Community Housing** Funds can be used for the acquisition, creation, preservation and support of Community Housing in Phillipston.

He explores the transformation of his yard from a boring suburban lot dominated by lawn to a rich habitat for our natural wildlife. Removing invasive species, planting native plants, and providing water, food, and cover for a variety of wildlife and people. The result is a space that has become a wonderful place to hang out with family and friends enjoying a wide variety of wildlife.

Focusing on lands of conservation interest, he has organized biological inventories finding and documenting state listed species for The MA Natural Heritage and Endangered Species Program and the US Army Corps of Engineers. 
